CHARACTER DESCRIPTIONS

ROSEMARY PILKINGTON – Office Secretary.

A secretary who is far more interested in finding a man to marry than advancing her career. After meeting Ponty, she immediately sets her sights on becoming Mrs. Finch. She supports him in his climb to succeed in the company. She is spurned and ignored several times throughout the show, but continues to return to Finch.

HEDY LA RUE - The Other Woman.

Hedy is the sexy bombshell who is having an affair with Biggley. She is not bright, but knows how to use her looks to succeed in the company. She later appears as the pirate mascot in the company "treasure hunt."

SMITTY - Office Secretary.

Smitty is friend and confidante of Rosemary. She is less idealistic (although also keen to find a man) than Rosemary and encourages her in her efforts to snag Finch. Quick-witted and cynical with a dry sense of humor.

MISS JONES - Mr. Biggley's secretary.

Miss Jones is the abrupt and tough executive secretary to Biggley. She keeps him in line, and all employees try to stay out of her way - although Finch manages to worm his way onto her good side.

MISS KRUMHOLTZ - Mr. Gatch's secretary.

Miss Krumholtz is the professional secretary that is completely loyal to the executive she is assigned to that day.

FEMALE ENSEMBLE (Secretaries) Various vocal ranges.

Rosemary: Hello, Ponty. You're first office. It's beautiful. I can only stay a minute. I just wanted to tell you that I had a good time the other night. But – just one thing Ponty...About what happened later. I mean, when we said goodnight.
